



Critical Care Locums

North Bay Regional Health Centre is seeking Critical Care Locums interested in practicing medicine in beautiful Northern Ontario.

Description of Service:

The Critical Care Unit (CCU) Locum is responsible for the primary intensive care and ventilatory management of patients admitted to the 16 bed CCU. This service is supported by physician assistants during daytime hours along with a multidisciplinary team including respiratory therapy and a dedicated CCU pharmacist.

Locum CCU physicians provide consultation to the emergency department and Critical coverage for the Nipissing Region.

Our Critical Care locum assignments are 7 days in duration from Monday morning until handover the following Monday morning. Locums provide services to the unit each day from 7 AM to 5 PM, they also provide two nights of overnight coverage during the week.

Qualifications:

 Qualified applicants will have licensure to practice independently in Ontario and a standing Critical Care fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

 This position will be remunerated with a combination of OHIP fee for service billings and Hospital On-Call Compensation (HOCC). Our locums are HealthForce Ontario NSLP funded (respite+ coverage) which includes daily honorarium, travel sessionals as well as travel and accommodation expenses.
